Conference Objectives

This conference will address the complex landscape of chronic pain treatment across the continuum of primary and specialty care including education on pharmacological and non-pharmacological options.

The curriculum is intended for participants with fundamental as well as advanced knowledge of chronic pain. The focus of the meeting is on clinical topics of ethical prescribing for pain patients, interventional pain treatments, options and advances, palliative care, pain related sleep issues and provider burnout.

- Recognize the basis of burnout, identify the signs of burnout and review mitigation strategies for minimizing the adverse effects.
