DESCRIPTION

In this two-day lecture and lab-based class, we will explore exciting new studies as well as learn the practical applications of Neuro-Lymphatic Therapy (NLT) for the purposes of tissue and central nervous system (CNS) detoxification. OBJECTIVES

- List the rationale of each of the five concepts of MLD and how they relate to the anatomy and physiology of the lymphatic system
- List indications and contraindications for NLT
- Identify indications of lymphatic and cerebrospinal fluid stagnation, explain how this can influence function and pain, and describe what manual interventions should be used
- Demonstrate the proper hand positions of cranial therapy and the hand placements for a general head and neck sequence; as well as the general thorax, spine, and abdominal sequence of NLT
- Demonstrate a correct manual sequence utilizing NLT for positive client/patient outcomes and list the correct order in which to apply NLT with other manual modalities
- Instruct the client/patient in basic self-care routines of NLT to extend therapy sessions and facilitate selfmanagement
