CREDITS

Early registration deadline: November 23, 2018

The early registration fee for healthcare professionals is \$130 for Day 1, \$50 for Day 2, and \$175 for Both Days; for BIANC members (\$100 professoinal level only) is \$97.50 for Day 1, \$37.50 for Day 2, and \$131.25 for Both Days; for healthcare students (proof of enrollment required at check-in) is \$50 for Day 1 and \$75 for Both Days, and for persons with TBI/family members it is \$25 for Day 2. These program fees include administrative costs, educational materials, light breakfast, and lunch (Friday only). If registration is received after the deadline, the total fee will be the registration fee + \$15.00.

MAHEC has a pay-up-front policy for all CE programs. The only exceptions will be for pre-approved programs where an individual payment plan is appropriate. Registrations received without accompanying payment will not be processed and participants who have not paid the course fee will not be admitted into the program.

Cancellations received at least two weeks in advance of the program date will receive a full refund unless otherwise noted. Cancellations received between two weeks and up to 48 hours prior to the program date will receive a 70% refund unless otherwise noted. No refunds will be given for cancellations received less than 48 hours prior to the program date. All cancellations must be made in writing (fax, mail, or email).
