#### The Cancer is Over, Now What?



**Kevin Oeffinger, MD,** is a family physician, the founding Director of the Duke Center for Onco-Primary Care, and the Director of the Supportive Care and Survivorship Center at Duke Cancer Institute. He is a Professor in the Department of Medicine at Duke University Medical Center. Dr. Oeffinger has a long-standing record of NIH-supported research in cancer screening and survivorship and has served

in a leadership capacity in various cancer-focused and primary care-focused national committees and organizations, including the American Society of Clinical Oncology, the American Cancer Society, and the American Academy of Family Physicians.

#### Integrating Research, Policy and Change Practice in AYA Oncology: Challenges and Opportunities



**Brad Zebrack, PhD, MSW, MPH,** is a Professor at the University of Michigan School of Social Work and a member of the Rogel Cancer Center's Health Behavior and Outcomes Research Program. Dr. Zebrack has clinical social work experience in both pediatric and adult oncology and has been involved in the development and evaluation of peer support programs for adolescent and young adult cancer

survivors. In 2017, Dr. Zebrack was awarded a Fulbright Scholarship for study in Australia, where he collaborated with colleagues to develop and evaluate supportive care services for adolescents and young adults affected by cancer. His academic research focuses on psychosocial outcomes and quality of life for cancer survivors and has been supported over the past 20 years from federal and foundation sources, including the National Cancer Institute, the Patient-Centered Outcomes Research Institute (PCORI), LiveStrong, and HopeLab Inc.

Brad Zebrack is also a long-term survivor of Hodgkin's lymphoma, diagnosed in 1985 at the age of 25. In 1988-1989 Brad and his wife, Joanne Kelleher, embarked on and completed a one-year, 11,000-mile bicycle tour around the perimeter of the United States to promote cancer survivorship.
