## DESCRIPTION

**Project ECHO®** is a lifelong learning and guided practice model that revolutionizes medical education to provide best-practice specialty care and reduce health disparities. ECHO is led by an expert team that uses multi-point videoconferencing to conduct virtual learning sessions comprised of a short didactic followed by case presentations provided by participants. Rural physicians have identified the need for expert medical advice with high-risk prenatal patients in their communities due to the closure of Labor and Delivery Departments at certain rural hospitals.

This video teleconferencing series, guided by experts, takes place over one year via monthly modules (one-hour each) and will cover topics such as:

- Fetal Growth Restriction
- Labor Induction
- Gestational Diabetes
- Perinatal Substance Use Disorder
- Hypertensive Disorders of Pregnancy
- Establishing an Estimated Due Date
