### SERIES DESCRIPTION

Studies have shown that Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) scores were directly connected with the development of serious emotional problems, health risk behaviors, social problems, adult disease, disability, mortality, high healthcare costs, and worker performance problems later in life. Higher ACE scores were directly connected with liver disease, chronic pulmonary obstructive disease, heart disease, autoimmune disease, lung cancer, depression, attempted suicide, hallucinations, the use of antipsychotic medications, the abuse of substances, multiple sex partners, and increased likelihood of becoming a victim of sexual assault or domestic violence.

North Carolina Area Heath Education Centers (AHECs) have joined together to reach our rural communities in order to raise awareness of how trauma affects our society and to promote resilience in response. Participants will learn the science of resiliency and develop skills to reduce the intergenerational effects of trauma on the lifespan of each participant and their greater community.

Physicians, nurses, pharmacists, psychologists, mental health and substance use professionals, social workers, law enforcement, school staff, community health workers, peer support specialists, and others who are interested in building a trauma-informed resilient culture within the community.

# LEVEL 1: INTRODUCTORY ONLINE COURSE Shifting the Lens: Creating a Culture that is Trauma-Informed and Resiliency-Focused

# DESCRIPTION

This two-part online course will provide a secure foundation in trauma-informed care, ACEs, and the science of resiliency. It was developed to provide both professionals and community members with a common understanding of the science of trauma and resiliency and the knowledge base with which to develop vital skills in resolving the effects of adverse childhood experiences and toxic stress in individuals, the workplace, and the community.

### **OBJECTIVES**

### Upon completion of this activity, participants will be able to:

- Determine the key factors in nurturing a trauma-informed and resiliency-focused (TIRF) culture
- Examine Adverse Childhood Events (ACEs) and the connection to psychosocial outcomes and chronic disease
- Identify the body's response to traumatic events and the science of resiliency in individual's, the workforce and communities
- Summarize ways to heal the effects of trauma and nurture resiliency using "connection as a solution

**Mary Lynn Barrett, LCSW, MPH**, has dual master's degrees in social work and public health from the University of Washington. She is the Director of Behavioral Medicine in the Family Practice Residency Program at MAHEC's Family Health Centers. Her current position involves both teaching physicians to manage the mental and behavioral health aspects of primary care and treating patients who experience

these challenges to their overall well-being. Mary Lynn has always been very interested in the relationship between stress, trauma, and chronic disease and is passionate about disseminating information about the Adverse Childhood Experiences Study along with resiliency tools so that systems, agencies, and individuals can become more trauma and resiliency informed and promote well-being for all. Currently, her research interests include developing training programs for workforce resiliency specific to healthcare settings. Mary Lynn is part of the leadership team of resiliency trainers who started the local non-profit agency, Resources for Resiliency and the curriculum, Reconnect for Resilience. She has taught about resiliency for many years locally in North Carolina, nationally, and internationally, having trained people in resiliency skills in Honduras, Rwanda, and Tanzania. Locally, Mary Lynn participates in Buncombe County's ACE Collaborative as part of the leadership committee and she is consultant to the Programs Committee of the African Healing Exchange, a non-profit organization that promotes resiliency and recovery in Africa.
