#### **MODULE 1**

# Understanding the Narrative: How we talk about what is happening impacts our overall well-being

Language we use to describe experiences impacts our thoughts and feelings, while setting the stage for recovery. Research shows that Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs) are likely to psychologically and physically impact children throughout their lifespan. When communicating with children, it's vital to share information in a developmentally appropriate manner while ensuring that adults are first clear on what is required. Dr. Heather Ulrich offers evidence-based, tried and true methods for creating optimal narratives and adjusting them to individual family needs. As a licensed psychologist and parent, she offers down-to-earth methods for communicating in a simple, honest, and age-appropriate manner.

#### Upon completion of this module, participants will be able to:

- Explain how the language we use to describe our experiences impacts our future, and our thoughts and feelings, while setting the stage for recovery
- Identify developmentally appropriate methods of talking to children about what is happening in their world

# Juggling it All: Adjusting to new roles and new demands in the family (includes one hour of ethics)

Stress and crises uniquely and predictably impact family systems. To survive and promote health, an understanding of roles is crucial, and healthy adaptation is vital. This module helps to identify new roles and demands within the family system, clarify therapeutic and ethical boundaries, and facilitate the application of evidence-based information to effectively cope with new demands.

#### Upon completion of this module, participants will be able to:

- Demonstrate the ability to identify new roles and demands being placed on each member of a family unit
- Identify therapeutic boundaries, abilities, and ethical limits in facing current and new challenges
- Review practical, science-based information to support engagement in new roles while assisting families as they cope with new demands

#### **Building Resilience and Coping Skills: How to learn from** tough times and help children grow despite adversity

Dr. Ulrich explains the impact of adversity on childhood development, while sharing strategies to transform uncertainty into resilience. She offers practical methods to mitigate the long-term impact of adverse experiences, as parents, families, therapists, and advocates cope with multidimensional stressors during uncertain times.

- · Explain how adversity impacts childhood development and functioning
- Define what resiliency is and why it is valuable in mitigating the long-term impact of adverse experiences
- Review and discuss practical, science-based strategies which foster resilience in the face of the current multidimensional stressors
