Keynote

- Describe a reflective approach to forging strong, trusting, collaborative relationships with parents
- Explain how a practitioner's own beliefs, values and professional approach may impact the highly charged work they do with families, and describe how mindfulness may impact and improve practice
- Practice applying a reflective approach to everyday work with families through brief interactive activities, feedback, and self-reflection

- Practice applying the reflective approach to current work with families, through anonymous case studies
- Identify one's own beliefs, values, triggers, and overall approach – so that, armed with enhanced awareness, practitioners may demonstrate application of skills that strengthen collaboration, while reducing obstacles to communication
- Describe a personalized, reflective approach that increases receptivity and results in a positive impact on children and families
- Discuss professional strategies for forging relationships with parents that maximize the likelihood that parents and families will benefit from professional guidance and expertise

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

CLAIRE LERNER, LCSW-C, is a licensed clinical social worker and child development specialist. She served as the Director of Parenting Resources at ZERO TO THREE for more than 18 years, where she oversaw the development of all parenting educational content. In addition, Claire has directed several professional development projects designed to build strong, trusting, collaborative relationships with families of

young children. Claire currently serves as the Senior Parenting Consultant at ZERO TO THREE to enable her to spend more time working directly with families.

Claire is the author of numerous parenting publications and articles, in addition to a podcast and video series for parents and professionals. Claire writes a column for PBSparents.org and has also written columns for *Parenting: The Early Years* and *American Baby* Magazines. She is frequently quoted in other parenting publications and has been a source on early childhood development for NPR and numerous national daily newspapers such as *The New York Times, Wall Street Journal, USA Today, Los Angeles Times, the Boston Globe* and *London Times*.

Claire has also been a practicing clinician for more than 30 years, partnering with parents to understand the behavior and development of their young children. She also provides consultation and training to local preschools and pediatric residents.

Claire has participated on numerous national advisory panels and task forces related to early child development including the National Parenting Education Network and the American Academy of Pediatrics' Committee on Early Childhood Development.

HEATHER ULRICH, PHD, is an Assistant Professor of Psychology at University of North Carolina Asheville, where she teaches about ACES and runs a research lab focused on ACEs and trauma. She is also a clinical psychologist licensed in the state of North Carolina. Her clinical practice specializes in infant mental health, attachment based disorders, toxic stress, trauma, relational neurobiology, and parenting. Dr. Ulrich serves the local Asheville community via her private practice, Brain Based Relationships (www.brainbasedrelationships.com). She is a founding board member of the North Carolina Infant Mental Health Association and a key planning committee member of the WNC Infant Mental Health Conference annually held at MAHEC.
