

# Moving Women Beyond the Trauma of Addiction

This workshop is designed to help attendees understand the neurobiology of addiction, identify family of origin issues, recognize "miracles" that ignite hope, and manage common barriers to treatment of women in recovery. The relationship between trauma and addiction is explored, in the context of gender-specific issues, and evidence-based treatment approaches are offered to help clients prevent re-traumatization. Attendees will learn how to increase the likelihood women with addiction will enter recovery and maintain sobriety, as they improve their understanding of neurobiological differences, gain information on helping clients foster healthy relationships, and learn about effective treatment approaches to assist clients with PTSD and other co-occurring disorders. Best-practice strategies are offered for reducing the impact of past trauma, creating new pathways for stress relief, and fostering connections which are specific and vital to women's recovery.

FACULTY

John Roberts, MD, Board Certified in Psychiatry, Neurology, Addiction Medicine, is the Medical Director and Addiction Psychiatrist for Pavillon. He came to Pavillon with nearly 20 years of experience serving as an Assistant Professor of Psychiatry at the Medical University of South Carolina. While at MUSC, he was the Attending Psychiatrist for the Inpatient Dual Diagnosis Unit and was also the Director of MUSC's Clinical Outpatient Division for the Center for Drugs and Alcohol Program.

Dr. Roberts received his doctor of medicine degree from Louisiana State University. He completed his psychiatric residency as well as fellowships in substance abuse and anxiety disorders at the Medical University of South Carolina. Dr. Roberts is board certified in psychiatry, neurology, and addiction medicine, and he has lectured throughout the Southeastern United States on substance use and psychiatric disorders.

Candace A. Champagne, MSW, LCSW, LCAS, ICAADC, NCTAS, is an expert in 12-step based Substance Use Disorders treatment. Her career includes more than a decade in private practice, developing and implementing treatment programs for clients struggling with SUD, Impulse-Control and Intimate Partner Violence. Candace is devoted to helping individuals recover from the disease of addiction and has returned to working in residential treatment where hope begins.

**Leslie D. McCrory, MA, LPC, LCAS, CCS,** is the Manager of Extended Care at Pavillon in Mill Springs. She has practiced in the Asheville area for 27 years in the field of mental health and substance abuse services in direct treatment, supervision, education and management. She has specialized in Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders and women's issues within the field of addiction.

Leslie received her Masters Degree in Counseling from the University of Alabama in Birmingham in 1983, and is a Licensed Professional Counselor, a Licensed Clinical Addiction Specialist and a Certified Clinical Supervisor.

Shannon Buck, BASW, CSAC, NLP, has more than 30 years of experience in the field of mental health and substance use disorders. She is an expert in Neurolinguistic Psychology and is a trained Hypnotherapist. Shannon has been a counselor on the women's clinical team at Pavillon for more than 6 years. She is also Pavillon's resident Reiki Master.

Charlene Nicely, PhD, LCAS, is a clinical psychologist and has spent more than 30 years helping people reclaim their lives and their self worth. She began her career in public mental health services in 1980. In 1984, she opened a private practice in Hendersonville, NC. Charlene worked with children, families, couples and individuals in her eclectic private practice prior to joining Pavillon as Clinical Director in 2005. She has performed in a variety of key roles over the years, each highly beneficial to the mission of the agency. Currently, Charlene works primarily with the women's programs at Pavillon, a residential substance abuse treatment center in Mill Spring, NC. Charlene is also a residential trainer at The Monroe Institute where she facilitates week-long meditation retreats. She brings a mix of humor, passion and experience to her trainings, with a focus on practical applications.

Nicole McLean, LPC, LCAS, has been a counselor on the women's team at Pavillon for more than a year. She assists with groups and individual counseling, conducts art in therapy, is trained in Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) therapy, and provides lectures. She is also involved with post treatment options and relapse prevention.

Nicole has been employed as a counselor in different facets since 2004. In a private practice setting in Wilmington NC, she provided individual outpatient therapy for children, adolescents and adults, as well as family, marital and parental support counseling. Nicole also worked in a community mental health center where she facilitated adult and adolescent chemical dependency treatment and mental health group sessions.

Margaret Radziszewska, CAC I, CSAC-I, has worked with families, children, adolescents and adults as a Rehabilitative Therapist since 1995 (Poland). She has been working in the substance abuse field, in a residential setting, for more than 12 years. Her experience includes: co-occurring disorders, family of origin and family dysfunction/relationships, trauma resolution, and pregnant/parenting women's issues. Using a multifaceted approach to therapy, Margaret is an expert at "meeting clients where they are" and educating them on self-empowerment strategies to resolve difficulties.
