

Folk medicine consists of the healing practices and ideas of body physiology and health preservation known to some in a culture, transmitted informally as general knowledge, and practiced or applied by anyone in the culture having prior experience. Folk medicine may also be referred to as traditional medicine, alternative medicine, indigenous medicine, complementary medicine, or natural medicine. Appalachian folk medicine has meant the difference between health and infirmity for many people over the years, absorbing elements from different traditions, reworking them, and applying them to everyday needs. This half day conference will discuss the history of Appalachian folk medicine and how some of the practices have influenced, or been influenced by, our formalized medicine system.

Integrative healthcare practitioners, pharmacists, registered nurses, residents, nurse practitioners, LPNs, CMAs, CNAs, massage therapists and community members desiring to acquire more knowledge on Appalachian folk medicine.
