DESCRIPTION

Project ECHO® is a lifelong learning and guided practice model that revolutionizes medical education to provide best-practice specialty care and reduce health disparities. ECHO is led by an expert team that uses multi-point videoconferencing to conduct virtual learning sessions comprised of a short didactic followed by case presentations provided by participants. This video teleconferencing series, guided by experts, takes place over eleven bi-weekly modules (one-hour each) and will cover topics specific to school nurses, including:

OBJECTIVES

- Develop skills to conduct Brief Negotiated Interviews (BNI) and use Motivational Interviewing (MI) skills in student interviews, healthy behavior reinforcement conversations, brief interventions, and referrals during the SBIRT process
