KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Russell Ware, MD, PhD, is a pediatric hematologist in Cincinnati, Ohio and is affiliated with Cincinnati Children's Hospital Medical Center. He completed his undergraduate education at Furman University, his medical and doctoral education at Duke University School of Medicine, and his post-graduate training at Texas Children's Hospital, in Houston, Texas. He has been in practice for 32 years and is currently the Director

of the Division of Hematology and is recognized as an expert in the field of sickle cell disease. Dr. Ware is the national principal investigator for several NHLBI-funded sickle cell clinical trials and has recently begun an international program to improve the diagnosis, treatment, and research for sickle cell disease in developing countries. His laboratory focuses on genetic modifiers of sickle cell disease, as well as the pharmacokinetics, pharmacodynamics, and pharmacogenetics of hydroxyurea therapy.
