Sample Case & Case Questions

Over the course of the last few months we have had multiple RTA's. Once they were stabilized, they were taken in by our sister facilities in the area. As we are planning reopening our Director of Marketing is pushing for no quarantine required for RTA's that are at our sister facilities. We should place them in Aseptic (general population). We have over 22 residents currently at sister facilities.
