Data Template Instructions

As part of the North Carolina evaluation of Triple P, practitioners are asked to submit data for all interventions completed each calendar quarter. This data is useful in several ways. For example, it serves as quality assurance for communities, and it allows for feedback from caregivers as to whether the program is meeting their needs.

The data we collect includes the number of children being served and the levels of Triple P intervention being provided. Additionally, we are collecting pre-intervention and post-intervention data for Level 3 and Level 4 families (the pre- and post- data is not required for Level 2 individual interventions). This template has been developed to offer a simple and consistent method for reporting data that has been collected during the calendar quarter.

How is the template structured, and what is included?

• The first "Practitioner Report" tab should be completed by all practitioners, regardless of the level of Triple P provided. Please complete a row for each intervention delivered in this reporting period. This includes Level 2 individual interventions ("Brief Primary Care").

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

 - Please note that for those completing Level 4 Group Teen or Level 4 Standard Teen, they
 will NOT have a hostility score on the Parenting Scale. Please leave this item blank, as
 the Parenting Scale for Adolescents does not have that particular subscale. These families
 will still have the following scores: Total Score, Laxness, and Over-reactivity.
 - Also for Level 4, separate tabs have been developed for alternative child behavior measurement options. For families that have utilized the ECBI, CBCL, or DBL as the child behavior measure, we will provide templates for entering that data at your request.



Submitting Data

- For reference, 2018 remaining due dates are as follows:
 - \circ For Quarter ending 9/30/18 , data is due 10/15/18
 - For Quarter ending 12/31/18, data is due 1/15/19
- Please submit pre intervention data for all closed cases, even if you do not have the post data. If the case is still active, and post data is expected, please do not submit that data until the case is closed (and no further data is expected).
