FAMILY MEDICINE ELECTIVES

Acting Internship: #FMME 421

A FOUR-WEEK ELECTIVE WITH THE MAHEC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM - ASHEVILLE

Students serve as acting interns along with the Family Medicine patient care team on the Family Medicine hospital service at this 800-bed teaching hospital. Supervision will be by MAHEC Family Medicine Residency Faculty. Daily activities include rounds, conferences, patient work-ups, supervised procedures and other in-patient management. Students are included in the call schedule with the family practice residents on service (one Saturday).

Ambulatory Care: #FMME 430

A FOUR-WEEK ELECTIVE WITH THE MAHEC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM - ASHEVILLE

Students will see patients in the MAHEC Family Health Center as part of the residency program practice with mostly faculty and some upper level residents. Students will participate in morning learning conferences that include X-rays, dermatology, procedures and behavioral health. Students are required to attend weekly didactics. One half- day is spent in inpatient observing the Family Practice Service.

Combined Ambulatory Care: #FMME 457

A FOUR-WEEK ELECTIVE: TWO WEEKS IN ASHEVILLE AND TWO WEEKS IN HENDERSONVILLE

This rotation will give students the opportunity to experience both residency programs.

During the two week Asheville portion, students will see patients in the MAHEC Family Health Center as part of the residency program practice with mostly faculty and some upper level residents. Students will participate in morning learning conferences that include X-rays, dermatology, procedures and behavioral health. Students are required to attend weekly didactics. One half-day is spent in inpatient observing the Family Practice Service.

During the two week Hendersonville portion, students will see patients at MAHEC's Hendersonville Rural Family Medicine Residency Program. Students work one-on-one with full-time faculty and residents caring for patients in the multiple residency clinics. Depending on season and interest, other activities include afternoons at the resident-run homeless clinic, mornings at the procedure clinic, group visits and community outreach visits at migrant farmworker camps during the summer. Depending on time of year, students will also round in the 200-bed hospital on mornings, following several patients and working with residents and faculty assigned to the hospital service. The rotation will include a didactics afternoon and may include two call nights with an upper level resident and faculty.

Rural Acting Internship: #FMME 458

A FOUR-WEEK ELECTIVE WITH THE MAHEC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM - HENDERSONVILLE

A four week elective set in the MAHEC Hendersonville Rural Family Medicine Residency Program at the outpatient Family Health Center with inpatient services at Pardee Hospital. Students round in the 200-bed hospital each morning, following several patients and working one-on-one with an upper level resident and faculty. Daily activities include rounds, conferences, patient work-ups, supervised procedures and other in-patient management. Students are included in the call schedule with the Family Medicine residents on service. As an Al you will work under the supervision of upper level Family Medicine residents under the guidance of faculty attendings. The Al rotation is also an opportunity for you to get to know our residency and our people, and for us to get to know you.

Rural Inpatient and Outpatient Family Medicine Rotation in Boone: #FMME 461

A FOUR-WEEK ELECTIVE WITH THE MAHEC FAMILY MEDICINE RESIDENCY PROGRAM – BOONE

This is a four-week rotation where students will spend time on our busy family-medicine-run hospital service, round in the newborn nursery, and see patients in the family medicine continuity clinic. Daily activities include rounds, conferences, patient work-ups, supervised procedures and other in-patient management. Students will work under the supervision of faculty attendings. Students will have an opportunity to identify the challenges in providing care in a rural community and with limited regional resources. The rotation is also an opportunity for you to get to know our residency and our people, and for us to get to know you.

Our rotations are only available to students who are planning to specialize in Family Medicine and will be applying to our residency programs.

Step 1: Apply for Elective using the Visiting Student Learning Opportunities (VSLO®)

- Apply for elective using VSLO® https://www.aamc.org/students/medstudents/vsas/
- The host institution for MAHEC is UNC Chapel Hill
- VSAS® will open in January
- Complete application process as instructed and provide all required documents
- The Visiting Student Coordinator with UNC Chapel Hill will confirm receipt of application
- Applications will be reviewed for consideration by program for acceptance (space is limited)
- Once you have completed and submitted all required documents and you have been approved and cleared, you will receive an acceptance email by Chapel Hill and MAHEC

Step 2: Complete the Onboarding Process for MAHEC

An affiliate agreement with your school is required before you can start your rotation.

- MAHEC Application, Confidentiality Statement, Background Check
- Current PPD and FLU Vaccination
- Copy of Driver's License
- Current Certificate of Insurance (professional liability)
- School Student Evaluation Form

Please note: Students who will be working in one of our hospitals will be required to complete a separate onboarding process with Mission Hospital and Pardee Hospital. The onboarding process with these hospitals must be completed at least two (2) weeks prior to the start of your rotation.
